This procedure will continue until agreement is reached and a contract is produced. If the County cannot negotiate an agreement, the procedure will be terminated.

Section 3. Selection Committee

Because of the diversity of the departments and activities of the County, the responsible department head will appoint the selection committee for this project. Typically, the committee will consist of at least one professional in the task required, a person knowledgeable about procurement practices, and either a representative of the department requesting the project, or the department executing the project. However, this structure is not binding. Other members may be appointed as necessary and appropriate, but the total number of persons on the selection committee shall not exceed four (4) persons. Committee appointments shall be in writing and shall briefly describe the scope of the project and, if necessary, the primary disciplines required to accomplish the project, in order to assist the committee in developing a list of firms that might best accomplish the work required.

Section 4. Engineering Firm's Services

A. A description of services that may be utilized under this RFQ includes:

1. Surveying Services:

- Site and topographic survey to locate building within the facility and establish final floor elevation
- Location of below grade utilities and storm drainage piping identified by the airport to possibly cause interference (please note that no relocation of piping will be considered at this time)
- Provide physical measurements to determine the eave height of the existing adjacent hangar in order to match eave heights

2. **Civil Engineering Services:**

- Design of pre-engineered metal building foundation based on column reactions (to be provided by the County)
- Development of project specification package including building plan and specification
- Development of final grading plan to provide positive drainage away from the structure and directed to existing drainage path

3. **Architectural Services:**

- Layout of small office area and restrooms within the building

4. **MEP Services:**

- Construction drawing and specification development production for heating/cooling requirements of office and restroom facilities
- Construction drawing and specification package development for electrical service and base branch circuits required within the structure. This will also include coordination services with the airport and utility provided
- Construction drawing and specification package development for water and sanitary sewer requirements within the structure along with coordination with the airport and utilities provider

5. **Geotechnical Services and Foundation Design Parameters:** Are not included in the RFQ. The County will provide geotechnical data and foundation design parameters for the adjacent facilities on site.

6. **Construction Management Services:** Are not included in this RFQ.

7. **Deliverables:** The awarded Engineering Firm's deliverables shall include a complete set of construction documents (signed and sealed by a licensed engineer in the State of Texas) for all items included in the in the scope of work as outlined in this RFQ.

8. **Subcontracting:** No subcontracting will be allowed under this RFQ.

Section 5. **Laws and Regulations**

A. The Engineering Firm awarded services under this RFQ must comply with all laws, ordinances, and rules and regulations which govern the work specified in this contract.

Section 6. Insurance

The contractor (including any and all subcontractors as defined in Section 7.1.3 below) shall, at all times during the term of this contract, maintain insurance coverages with not less than the type and requirements shown below. Such insurance is to be provided at the sole cost of the contractor. These requirements do not establish limits of the contractor's liability.

All policies of insurance shall waive all rights of subrogation against the County, its officers, employees and agents.

Contractor shall furnish Jefferson County with Certificate of Insurance naming Jefferson County as additional insured.

All insurance must be written by an insurer licensed to conduct business in the State of Texas.

Section 7. Workers' Compensation Insurance

7.1 Definitions:

7.1.1 **Certificate of coverage ("Certificate")** – A copy of a certificate of insurance, a certificate of authority to self-insure issued by the commission, or a coverage agreement, DWC-81, DWC-82, DWC-83, or DWC-84 showing statutory workers' compensation insurance coverage for the person's or entity's employees providing services on a project, for the duration of the project.

7.1.2 **Duration of the project** – Includes the time from the beginning of the work on the project until the contractor's/person's work on the project has been completed and accepted by the governmental entity.

7.1.3 **Persons providing services on the project ("subcontractor") in article 406.096** – Includes all persons or entities performing all or part of the services under the contractor has undertaken to perform on the project, regardless of whether that person contracted directly with the contractor and regardless of whether that person has employees. This includes, without limitation, independent contractors, subcontractor, leasing companies, motor carriers, owner-operators, employees of any such entity, or employees of any entity which furnishes persons to provide services on the project. "Services" includes, without limitation, providing, hauling or delivering equipment or materials, or providing labor, transportation, or other service related to a project. "Services" does not include activities unrelated to the project, such as food/beverage vendors, office supply deliveries, and delivery of portable toilets.

7.2 The Contractor shall provide coverage, based on proper reporting of classification code and payroll amounts and filing any coverage agreements, which meets the statutory requirements of Texas Labor Code, Section 401.011(44) for all employees of the contractor providing services on the project, for the duration of the project.

7.3 The Contractor must provide a certificate of coverage to the governmental entity prior to being awarded the contract – refer to Section 6 above.

7.4 If the coverage period shown on the Contractor's current certificate of coverage ends during the duration of the project, the Contractor must, prior to the end of the coverage period, file a new certificate of coverage with the governmental entity showing that coverage has been extended.

- 7.5 The Contractor shall obtain from each person providing services on a project, and provide to the governmental entity:
- 7.5.1 A certificate of coverage, prior to that person beginning work on the project, so the governmental entity will have on file certificates of coverage showing coverage for all persons providing services on the project; and
- 7.5.2 No later than seven (7) days after receipt by the Contractor, a new certificate of coverage showing extension of coverage, if the coverage period shown on the current certificate ends during the duration of the project.
- 7.6 The Contractor shall retain all required certificates of coverage for the duration of the project and for one (1) year thereafter.
- 7.7 The Contractor shall notify the governmental entity in writing by certified mail or personal delivery, within ten (10) days after the contractor knew or should have known, of any change that materially affects the provision of coverage of any person providing services on the project.
- 7.8 The Contractor shall post on each project site a notice, in the text, form and manner prescribed by the Texas Department of Workers' Compensation, informing all persons providing services on the project that they are required to be covered, and stating how a person may verify coverage and report lack of coverage.
- 7.9 The Contractor shall contractually require each person with whom it contracts to provide services on a project to:
- 7.9.1 Provide coverage, based on reporting of classification codes and payroll amounts and filing of any coverage agreements, which meets the statutory requirements of Texas Labor Code, Section 401.011(44) for all its employees providing services on the project, for the duration of the project.
- 7.9.2 Provide to the Contractor, prior to that person beginning work on the project a certificate of coverage showing that coverage is being provided for all employees of the person providing services on the project, for the duration of the project.
- 7.9.3 Provide the Contractor, prior to the end of coverage period, a new certificate of coverage showing extension of coverage, if the coverage period shown on the current certificate of coverage ends during the duration of the project.
- 7.9.4 Obtain from each person with whom it contracts, and provide to the Contractor:
- 7.9.4.1 A certificate of coverage, prior to the other person beginning work on the project; and
- 7.9.4.2 the coverage period, if the coverage period shown on the current certificate of a new certificate of coverage showing extension of coverage, prior to the end of coverage ends during the duration of the project.
- 7.9.5 Retain all required certificates of coverage on file for the duration of the project and for one (1) year thereafter.
- 7.9.6 Notify the governmental entity in writing by certified mail or personal delivery, within ten (10) days after the person knew or should have known, of any change that materially affects the provision of coverage of any person providing services on the project; and
- 7.9.7 Contractually require each person with whom it contracts to perform as required by paragraphs 7.1 – 7.7., with the certificates of coverage to be provided to the person for whom they are providing services.
- 7.10 By signing this contract or providing or causing to be provided a certificate of coverage, the Contractor is representing to the governmental entity that all employees of the contractor who will provide services of the project will be covered by workers' compensation coverage for the duration of the project, that the coverage will be based on proper reporting of classification codes and payroll amounts, and that all coverage agreements will be filed with the appropriate insurance carrier or, in the case of a self-insured, with the commission's Division of Self-Insurance Regulation. Providing false or misleading information may subject the contractor to administrative penalties, criminal penalties, civil penalties, or other civil actions.
- 7.11 The Contractor's failure to comply with any of these provisions is a breach of contract by the Contractor which entitles the governmental entity to declare the contract void if the Contractor does not remedy the breach within ten (10) days after receipt of notice of breach from the governmental entity.

Section 8. Qualifications Statement Requirements

Firms desiring to be considered for Engineering Services as described in this RFQ are required to submit a Statement of Qualifications and Experience in order to be considered. Only firms with statements on file with the County will be evaluated. The statement should contain, as a minimum, the following:

1. Name of the firm wishing to contract with the County.
2. Firm's local address.
3. Firm's corporate or main office address.
4. Number of years the firm has been in business.
5. Names, qualifications, and experience of professional staff who would be assigned to Jefferson County.
6. Firm's organization chart.
7. Biographies or resumes, including home office location and other relevant information, for each key staff member likely to be assigned to a project.
8. Names, titles, address, and telephone numbers of persons who are authorized to negotiate for and contractually bind the firm. One of these persons should sign the response. A contact must be named for addressing questions generated during the evaluation process.
9. A description of representative work accomplished for all jobs within the past five (5) years.
10. Provide a detailed summary of the firm's experience in providing the kinds of services specified in this RFQ to governmental entities.
11. Describe reasons why the firm would be uniquely qualified to provide Engineering Services to Jefferson County.
12. Describe any unique services offered by your firm.
13. A list of references, other than Jefferson County, who have contracted the types of work the firm, is offering to perform. A reference form is included on Page 8 of this package.

Section 9. Additional Information

1. Provide a listing of all current litigation(s), outstanding judgements and liens affecting the firm.

Section 10. Terms and Conditions

1. Jefferson County reserves the right to request clarification of information submitted and to request additional information of one or more applicants.
2. Any agreement or contract resulting from this RFQ shall be on forms approved by Jefferson County and shall contain, at minimum, applicable provisions of this document. Jefferson County reserves the right to reject any agreement that does not conform to this document and any County requirements and contracts.
3. The Engineering Firm shall not assign any interest in the contract and shall not transfer any interest in the same without prior written consent of the County.
4. No reports, information, or data given to or prepared by the Engineering Firm under contract shall be made available to any individual or organization by the Engineering Firm without the prior written approval of the County.

5. Vendor Registration: SAM (System for Award Management).

Vendors doing business with Jefferson County are **required** to be registered with The System for Award Management (SAM), with an “active” status. The System for Award Management (SAM) is the Official U.S. Government system that consolidated the capabilities of CCR/FedReg, ORCA, and EPLS. There is NO fee to register for this site.

For that reason, all of the terms and conditions of the contract are contained in the IFB, unless any of the terms and conditions is modified by an IFB Amendment, a Contract Amendment, or by mutually agreed terms and conditions in the contract documents.

11. **Waiver of Subrogation**

Bidder and bidder's insurance carrier waive any and all rights whatsoever with regard to subrogation against Jefferson County as an indirect party to any suit arising out of personal or property damages resulting from bidder's performance under this agreement.

12. **Fiscal Funding**

A multi-year contract (if requested by the specifications) continuing as a result of an extension option must include fiscal funding out. If, for any reason, funds are not appropriated to continue the contract, said contract shall become null and void.

13. **Bid Results**

Bid results are not provided in response to telephone inquiries. A preliminary tabulation of bids received will be posted on the Purchasing web page (<http://co.jefferson.tx.us/purchasing/main.htm>) as soon as possible following bid opening. A final tabulation will be posted following bid award, and will also be available for review in the Purchasing Department.

14. **Changes and Addenda to Bid Documents**

Each change or addendum issued in relation to this IFB document will be on file in the Office of the Purchasing Agent, and will be posted on the Purchasing web site as soon as possible. It shall be the bidder's responsibility to make inquiry as to change or addenda issued, and to monitor the web site. All such changes or addenda shall become part of the contract and all bidders shall be bound by such addenda. Information on all changes or addenda issued will be available at the Office of the County Purchasing Agent.

15. **Specifications**

Unless otherwise stated by the bidder, the bid will be considered as being in accordance with Jefferson County's applicable standard specifications, and any special specifications outlined in the bid document. References to a particular trade name, manufacturer's catalogue, or model number are made for descriptive purposes to guide the bidder in interpreting the requirements of Jefferson County, and should not be construed as excluding bids on other types of materials, equipment, and supplies. However, the bidder, if awarded a contract, will be required to furnish the particular item referred to in the specifications or description unless departure or substitution is clearly noted and described in the bid. Jefferson County reserves the right to determine if equipment/ product being bid is an acceptable alternate. All goods shall be new unless otherwise so stated in the bid. Any unsolicited alternate bid, or any changes, insertions, or omissions to the terms and conditions, specifications, or any other requirements of the bid, may be considered non-responsive.

16. **Delivery**

Bids shall include all charges for delivery, packing, crating, containers, etc. Unless otherwise stated by the bidder (in writing on the included Bid Form), prices bid will be considered as being based on F.O.B. destination/delivered freight included.

17. **Interpretation of Bid and/or Contract Documents**

All inquiries shall be made within a reasonable time prior to the date and time fixed for the bid opening, in order that a written response in the form of an addendum, if required, can be processed before the bids are opened. Inquiries received that are not made in a timely fashion may or may not be considered.

18. Currency

Prices calculated by the bidder shall be stated in U.S. dollars.

19. Pricing

Prices shall be stated in units of quantity specified in the bid documents. In case of discrepancy in computing the amount of the bid, the unit price shall govern.

20. Notice to Proceed/Purchase Order

The successful bidder may not commence work under this contract until authorized to do so by the Purchasing Agent.

21. Certification

By signing the offer section of the Offer and Acceptance page, bidder certifies:

- The submission of the offer did not involve collusion or other anti-competitive practices.
- The bidder has not given, offered to give, nor intends to give at any time hereafter, any economic opportunity, future employment, gift, loan, gratuity, special discount, trip, favor, or service to any public servant in connection with the submitted offer.
- The bidder hereby certifies that the individual signing the bid is an authorized agent for the bidder and has the authority to bind the bidder to the contract.

22. Definitions

“County” – Jefferson County, Texas.

“Contractor” – The bidder whose proposal is accepted by Jefferson County.

23. Minority-Women Business Enterprise Participation

It is the desire of Jefferson County to increase the participation of Minority (MBE) and women-owned (WBE) businesses in its contracting and procurement programs. While the County does not have any preference or set aside programs in place, it is committed to a policy of equitable participation for these firms.

General Conditions of Bidding and Terms of Contract

By execution of this document, the vendor accepts all general and special conditions of the contract as outlined below and in the specifications and plans.

1. Bidding

1.1 Bids. All bids must be submitted on the bid form furnished in this package.

1.2 Authorized Signatures. The bid must be executed personally by the vendor, duly authorized partner of the partnership, or duly authorized officer of the corporation. If executed by an agent, a power of attorney or other evidence of authority to act on behalf of the vendor shall accompany the bid to become a valid bid.

1.3 Late Bids. Bids must be in the office of the Jefferson County Purchasing Agent before or at the specified time and date bids are due. Bids received after the submission deadline shall be rejected as non-responsive and returned unopened.

1.4 Withdrawal of Bids Prior to Bid Opening. A bid may be withdrawn before the opening date by submitting a written request to the Purchasing Agent. If time allows, the bidder may submit a new bid. Bidder assumes full responsibility for submitting a new bid before or at the specified time and date bids are due. Jefferson County reserves the right to withdraw a request for bids before the opening date.

1.5 Withdrawal of Bids after Bid Opening. Bidder agrees that its offer may not be withdrawn or cancelled by the vendor for a period of ninety (90) days following the date and time designated for the receipt of bids unless otherwise stated in the bid and/or specifications.

1.6 Bid Amounts. Bids shall show net prices, extensions where applicable and net total. In case of conflict between unit price and extension, the unit price will govern. Any ambiguity in the bid as a result of omission, error, unintelligible or illegible wording shall be interpreted in the favor of Jefferson County.

1.7 Exceptions and/or Substitutions. All bids meeting the intent of the specifications and plans will be considered for award. Vendors taking exception to the specifications and plans, or offering substitutions, shall state these exceptions in the section provided. If bid is made on an article other than the one specified, which a bidder considers comparable, the name and grade of said article must be specified in the bid and sufficient specifications and descriptive data must accompany same to permit thorough evaluation. The absence of stated exceptions and/or substitutions shall indicate that the vendor has not taken any exceptions to the specifications and shall be responsible to perform in strict accordance with the specifications. As a matter of practice, Jefferson County rejects exception(s) and /or substitutions as non-responsive but reserves the right to accept any and/or all of the exception(s) and/or substitution(s) deemed to be in the best interest of Jefferson County.

1.8 Alternates. The Invitation for Bid and/or specifications may expressly allow bidder to submit an alternate bid. Presence of such an offer shall not be considered an indication of non-responsiveness.

1.9 Descriptions. Unless otherwise specified, any reference to make, manufacturer and/or model used in the bid specifications is merely descriptive and not restrictive, and is used only to indicate type, style, or quality of material desired.

1.10 Bid Alterations. Bids cannot be altered or amended after submission deadline. Any interlineations, alterations, or erasures made before opening time must be initialed by the signer of the bid, guaranteeing authenticity.

1.11 Tax Exempt Status. Jefferson County is exempt from federal excise tax and state sales tax. Unless the bid form or specifications specifically indicate otherwise, the bid price must be net, exclusive of above-mentioned taxes and will be so construed. Therefore, the bid price shall not include taxes.

1.12 Quantities. Quantities indicated are estimated quantities only and are not a commitment to buy. Approximate usage does not constitute an order, but only implies the probable quantity that will be used. Commodities will be ordered on an as-needed basis. Bidder is responsible for accurate final counts.

1.13 Bid Award. Award of contract shall be made to the most responsible, responsive bidder, whose offer is determined to be the best value, taking into consideration the relative importance of price. Jefferson County reserves the right to be the sole judge as to whether items bid will serve the purpose intended.

Jefferson County reserves the right to accept or reject in part or in whole any bid submitted, and to waive any technicalities or informalities for the best interest of the County. Jefferson County reserves the right to award based upon individual line items, sections or total bid.

1.14 Silence of Specifications for Complete Units. All materials, equipment and/or parts that will become a portion of the completed work, including items not specifically stated herein but, necessary to render the service(s) complete and operational per the specifications, are to be included in the bid price. Vendor may be required to furnish evidence that the service, as bid, will meet or exceed these requirements.

1.15 Addenda. Any interpretations, corrections or changes to the specifications and plans will be made by addenda no later than forty-eight (48) hours prior to the bid opening. Addenda will be posted on the Purchasing web site. Vendors are responsible for monitoring the web site in order to remain informed on addenda. Vendors shall acknowledge receipt of all addenda with submission of bid.

1.16 General Bid Bond/Surety Requirements. Failure to furnish bid bond/surety, if requested, will result in bid being declared non-responsive. Non-responsive bids will not be considered for award.

1.17 General Insurance Requirements. Failure to furnish Affidavit of Insurance, if required in these specifications, will result in bid being declared non-responsive. Non-responsive bids will not be considered for award.

1.18 Responsiveness. A responsive bid shall substantially conform to the requirements of this Invitation to Bid and/or specifications contained herein. Bidders who substitute any other terms, conditions, specifications and/or requirements or who qualify their bids in such a manner as to nullify or limit their liability to the contracting entity shall have their bids deemed non-responsive. Also, bids containing any clause that would limit contracting authority shall be considered non-responsive. Examples of non-responsive bids include but shall not be limited to: a) bids that fail to conform to required delivery schedules as set forth in the bid request; b) bids with prices qualified in such a manner that the bid price cannot be determined, such as with vague wording that may include "price in effect at the time of delivery," and c) bids made contingent upon award of other bids currently under consideration.

1.19 Responsible Standing of Bidder. To be considered for award, bidder must at least: have the ability to obtain adequate financial resources, be able to comply with required or proposed delivery/completion schedule, have a satisfactory record of performance; have a satisfactory record of integrity and ethics, and be otherwise qualified and eligible to receive award.

1.20 Proprietary Data. Bidder may, by written request, indicate as confidential any portion(s) of a bid that contain proprietary information, including manufacturing and/or design processes exclusive to the vendor. Jefferson County will protect from public disclosure such portions of a bid, unless directed otherwise by legal authority, including existing Open Records Acts.

1.21 Public Bid Opening. Bidders are invited to be present at the opening of bids. After the official opening of bids, a period of not less than one week is necessary to evaluate bids. The amount of time necessary for bid evaluation may vary and is determined solely by the County. Following the bid evaluation, all bids submitted are available for public review.

2. Performance

2.1 Design, Strength, and Quality. Design, strength, and quality of materials and workmanship must conform to the highest standards of manufacturing and engineering practices. The apparent silence of specifications and/or plans as to any detailed description concerning any point shall be regarded as meaning that only the best commercial practices are to prevail. All interpretations of these specifications and/or plans shall be made on the basis of this statement.

2.2 Age and Manufacture. All tangible goods being bid must be new and unused, unless otherwise specified, in first-class condition, of current manufacture, and furnished ready to use. All items not specifically mentioned that are required for a complete unit shall be furnished.

2.3 Delivery Location. All deliveries will be made to the address(es) specified on the purchase order during normal working hours of 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m., Monday through Friday, unless otherwise authorized by the Purchasing Agent or designee.

2.4 Delivery Schedule. Delivery time may be an important consideration in the evaluation of best value. The maximum number of days necessary for delivery ARO shall be stated in the space, if provided, on the bid form.

2.5 Delivery Charges. All delivery and freight charges, F.O.B. destination shown on Jefferson County purchase order, as necessary to perform contract are to be included in the bid price.

2.6 Installation Charges. All charges for assembly, installation and set-up shall be included in the bid price. Unless otherwise stated, assembly, installation and set-up will be required.

2.7 Operating Instructions and Training. Clear and concise operating instructions and descriptive literature will be provided in English, if requested. On-site detailed training in the safe and efficient use and general maintenance of item(s) purchased shall be provided as needed at the request of Jefferson County. Instructions and training shall be at no additional cost to the County.

2.8 Storage. Bidder agrees to provide storage of custom ordered materials, if requested, for up to thirty (30) calendar days.

2.9 Compliance with Federal, State, County, and Local Laws. Bids must comply with all federal, state, county and local laws, including, but not limited to, all applicable standard safety, emission, and noise control requirements. Any vehicles or equipment shall contain all standard safety, emission, and noise control requirements required for the types and sizes of equipment at the time of their manufacture. The contractor agrees, during the performance of work or service, to comply with all applicable codes and ordinances of Jefferson County or the State of Texas as they may apply, as these laws may now read, or as they may hereafter be changed or amended.

2.10 OSHA. The bidder will certify all equipment complies with all regulations and conditions stipulated under the Williams-Steiger Occupational Safety and Health Act of 1971, as amended. The successful bidder will further certify that all items furnished under this project will conform and comply with federal and State of Texas OSHA standards. The successful bidder will agree to indemnify and hold harmless Jefferson County for any and all damages that may be assessed against the County.

2.11 Patents and Copyrights. The successful vendor agrees to protect the County from claims involving infringements of patents and/or copyrights.

2.12 Samples, Demonstrations and Testing. At Jefferson County's request and direction, bidder shall provide product samples and/or testing of items bid to ensure compliance with specifications. Samples, demonstrations and/or testing may be requested at any point prior to or following bid award. Samples, demonstrations and/or testing may be requested upon delivery and/or any point during the term of resulting contract. All samples (including return thereof), demonstrations, and/or testing shall be at the expense of the bidder/vendor.

2.13 Acceptability. All articles enumerated in the bid shall be subject to inspection by an officer designated for that purpose by Jefferson County. If found inferior to the quality called for, or not equal in value to the specifications, deficient in workmanship or otherwise, this fact shall be certified to the Purchasing Agent, who shall have the right to reject the whole or any part of the same. Items and/or work determined to be contrary to specifications must be replaced at the vendor's expense. Inferior items not retrieved by the vendor within thirty (30) calendar days, or an otherwise agreed upon time, shall become the property of the County. If disposal of such items warrants an expense, an amount equal to the disposal expense will be deducted from amounts payable to the vendor.

2.14 Maintenance. Maintenance required for equipment bid should be available in Jefferson County by a manufacturer authorized maintenance facility. Cost for this service shall be shown on the bid sheet as requested or on a separate sheet, as required. If Jefferson County opts to include maintenance, it shall be so stated in the purchase order and said cost will be included. Service will commence only upon expiration of applicable warranties and should be priced accordingly.

2.15 Material Safety Data Sheets. Under the "Hazardous Communications Act," common known as the "Texas Right to Know Act," a bidder must provide the user department, with each delivery, material safety data sheets which are applicable to hazardous substances defined in the Act. Failure of the bidder to furnish this documentation, will be cause to reject any bid applying thereto.

2.16 Evaluation. Evaluation shall be used as a determinant as to which services are the most efficient and/or most economical for the County. It shall be based on all factors having a bearing on price and performance of the items in the user environment. All bids are subject to tabulation by the Jefferson County Purchasing Department and recommendation to Jefferson County Commissioners' Court. Compliance with all bid requirements and needs of the using department are considered in evaluating bids. Pricing is not

the only criteria for making a recommendation. The Jefferson County Purchasing Department reserves to right to contact any bidder, at any time, to clarify, verify or requirement information with regard to this bid.

3. Purchase Orders and Payment

3.1 Purchase Orders. A purchase order(s) shall be generated by the Jefferson County Purchasing Agent to the successful vendor. The purchase order number must appear on all itemized invoices and packing slips. The County will not be held responsible for any work orders placed and/or performed without a valid current purchase order number. Payment will be made for all services rendered and accepted by the contract administrator for which a valid invoice has been received.

3.2 Invoices. All invoices shall reference the Purchase Order number. Invoices shall reference the bid item number or a detailed description for each item invoiced. If an item purchased and itemized on the invoice does not correspond to an item in any of the categories awarded to the vendor, invoice shall reference the item as "N/C" to indicate that it is a non-contract item. This requirement is to assist the County in verifying contract pricing on all invoices. Payment will be made under terms of net thirty (30) days unless otherwise agreed upon by seller and the purchasing department.

3.3 Prompt Payment. In accordance with the State of Texas Prompt Payment Act, Article 601f V.T.C.S., payment will be made after receive and acceptance by the County of the merchandise ordered and of a valid invoice. Successful bidder(s) is required to pay subcontractors within ten (10) days after the successful bidder receives payment from the County.

3.4 Funding. Jefferson County is operated and funded on an October 1 to September 30 basis; accordingly, the County reserves the right to terminate, without liability to the County, any contract for which funding is not available.

4. Contract

4.1 Contract Definition. The General Conditions of Bidding and Terms of Contract, Specifications, Plans, Bidding Forms, Addenda, and any other documents made a part of this bid shall constitute the complete bid. This bid, when duly accepted by Jefferson County, shall constitute a contract equally binding between the successful bidder and Jefferson County.

4.2 Change Order. No different or additional terms will become part of this contract with the exception of a change order. No oral statement of any person shall modify or otherwise change, or affect the terms, conditions or specifications stated in the resulting contract. All change orders to the contract will be made in writing and at the discretion and approval of Jefferson County. No change order will be binding unless signed by an authorized representative of the County and the vendor.

4.3 Price Re-determination. A price re-determination may be requested at the time of annual renewal. All requests for price re-determination shall be in written form. Cause for such request, i.e., manufacturer's direct cost, postage rates, Railroad Commission rates, Federal/State minimum wage law, Federal/State unemployment taxes, F.I.C.A, Insurance Coverage Rates, etc., shall be substantiated in writing by the source of the cost increase. The bidder's past experience of honoring contracts at the bid price will be an important consideration in the evaluation of the lowest and best bid. Jefferson County reserves the right to accept or reject any/all requests for price re-determination as it deems to be in the best interest of the County.

4.4 Termination. Jefferson County reserves the right to terminate the contract for default if the bidder breached any of the terms therein, including warranties of bidder or if the bidder becomes insolvent or commits acts of bankruptcy. Such right of termination is in addition to and not in lieu of any other remedies which Jefferson County may have in law or equity. Default may be construed as, but not limited to, failure to deliver the proper goods and/or service within the proper amount of time, and/or to properly perform any and all services required to Jefferson County's satisfaction and/or to meet all other obligations and requirements. Contracts may be terminated without cause upon thirty (30) days' written notice to either party unless otherwise specified. Jefferson County reserves the right to award canceled contract to the next lowest bidder. Bidder, in submitting this bid, agrees that Jefferson County shall not be liable to prosecution for damages in the event that the County declares the bidder in default.

4.5 Conflict of Interest. Employees of the County are not permitted to maintain financial interest in, or receive payment, directly or indirectly, borrow from, lend to, invest in, or engage in any substantial financial transaction with any individual, organization, supplier, or subcontractor who does business with the County without disclosure. When conflict of interest is discovered, it shall be grounds for termination of contract.

4.6 Injuries or Damages Resulting from Negligence. Successful vendor shall defend, indemnify and save harmless Jefferson County and all its officers, agents and employees from all suits, actions, or other claims of any character, name and description brought for or on account of any injuries or damages received or sustained by any person, persons, or property on account of any negligent act or fault of the successful vendor, or of any agent, employee, subcontractor or supplier in the execution of, or performance under, any contract which may result from bid award. Successful vendor shall pay any judgment with cost which may be obtained against Jefferson County growing out of such injury or damages.

4.7 Interest by Public Officials. No public official shall have interest in this contract, in accordance with Texas Local Government Code.

4.8 Warranty. The successful vendor shall warrant that all materials utilized in the performance of this contract shall conform to the proposed specifications and/or all warranties as stated in the Uniform Commercial Code and be free from all defects in material, workmanship and title.

4.9 Uniform Commercial Code. The successful vendor and Jefferson County agree that both parties have all rights, duties, and remedies available as stated in the Uniform Commercial Code.

4.10 Venue. This agreement will be governed and construed according to the laws of the State of Texas. This agreement is performable in the County of Jefferson, Texas.

4.11 Sale, Assignment, or Transfer of Contract. The successful vendor shall not sell, assign, transfer or convey this contract, in whole or in part, without the prior written consent of Jefferson County.

4.12 Silence of Specifications. The apparent silence of these specifications as to any detailed description concerning any point, shall be regarded as meaning that only the best commercial practices are to prevail. All interpretations of these specifications shall be made on the basis of this statement.

Special Requirements/Instructions

The following requirements and instructions supersede General Requirements where applicable.

1. Bid Requirement

Each bidder shall insure that all parts of the bid are **completed and returned**. The Table of Contents indicates specifically which pages need to be returned; these pages shall constitute the vendor's bid.

Vendor shall use an opaque envelope, clearly indicating on the outside the **Bid Number, Bid Description, and marked "SEALED BID"**. Jefferson County shall not be responsible for any effort or cost expended in the preparation of a response to this IFB. All protests should be coordinated through the Purchasing Office prior to award recommendation to Commissioners' Court. **Bidders** shall submit one (1) original, and two (2) copies of the bid.

2. Vendor Registration: SAM (System for Award Management).

Vendors doing business with Jefferson County are **required** to be registered with The System for Award Management (SAM), with an "active" status. The System for Award Management (SAM) is the Official U.S. Government system that consolidated the capabilities of CCR/FedReg, ORCA, and EPLS. There is NO fee to register for this site. Entities may register at no cost directly from the SAM website at: <https://www.sam.gov>

Bid Respondents are strongly encouraged to review their firm's SAM (System for Award Management) status prior to Bid Submission.

3. Awarded Vendor(s): Submission of FORM 1295 (Texas Ethics Commission)

As of January 1, 2016, per House Bill 1295, the Texas Ethics Commission (TEC) requires **all awarded vendors** to complete a Certificate of Interested Parties (FORM 1295) at time of notification of award. **Awarded Vendors** must visit the TEC website link below, enter the required information on Form 1295, and print a copy of the completed form. The form will include a certification of filing that will contain a unique certification number.

At the time of award, the Jefferson County Purchasing Department will submit a request to the Awarded Vendor to both:

1. Submit FORM 1295 online via the Texas Ethics Commission website link below.
2. Submit a printed copy of FORM 1295, signed by an Authorized Agent of the Awarded Vendor and notarized to the Jefferson County Purchasing Department.

4. Multiple Vendor Award

Jefferson County reserves the right to award this contract to more than one vendor at the County's discretion.

5. Delivery

If delivery is required, all items must be packaged so as to be protected from damage during shipping and handling. Any item(s) damaged in shipping must be replaced in kind, or repaired, by the contractor, at the discretion of, and at no additional charge to, Jefferson County.

6. Payment

Jefferson County will pay original invoices that clearly itemize the goods and/or services provided as to quantity, part number, description, price, applicable discount (if any), labor charges showing time differential, if applicable and if previously agreed to, and delivery, installation, and set-up costs, if applicable and if previously agreed to. Only charges as stated on the Bid Form(s) submitted as a part of the bid will be considered.

Invoices must indicate Jefferson County as applicable, the address to which the product(s) and/or service(s) were delivered, and the applicable purchase order number. Invoices will be matched to delivery tickets prior to payment; therefore, all delivery tickets should have an accurate description of the product(s) and/or service(s).

7. Usage Reports

Jefferson County reserves the right to request, and receive at no additional cost, up to two (2) times during the contract period, a usage report detailing the products and/or services furnished to date under a contract resulting from this IFB. The reports must be furnished no later than five (5) working days after written request and itemize all purchases to date by Jefferson County department, description of each item purchased, including manufacturer, quantity of each item purchased, per unit and extended price of each item purchased, and total amount and price of all items purchased.

8. Insurance

The contractor (including any and all subcontractors as defined in Section 9.1.3 below) shall, at all times during the term of this contract, maintain insurance coverages with not less than the type and requirements shown below. Such insurance is to be provided at the sole cost of the contractor. These requirements do not establish limits of the contractor's liability.

All policies of insurance shall waive all rights of subrogation against the County, its officers, employees and agents.

Contractor shall furnish Jefferson County with Certificate of Insurance naming Jefferson County as additional insured.

All insurance must be written by an insurer licensed to conduct business in the State of Texas.

9. Workers' Compensation Insurance

9.1 Definitions:

- 9.1.1 **Certificate of coverage ("Certificate")** – A copy of a certificate of insurance, a certificate of authority to self-insure issued by the commission, or a coverage agreement, DWC-81, DWC-82, DWC-83, or DWC-84 showing statutory workers' compensation insurance coverage for the person's or entity's employees providing services on a project, for the duration of the project.

Consider, possibly approve and authorize the County Judge to execute, receive and file a lease Agreement with Golden pass Products, LLC and Jefferson County for office space at the Airport.

TERMINAL LEASE AGREEMENT

This Terminal Lease Agreement (this "Lease Agreement") entered into by and between Jefferson County, Texas, a subdivision of the State of Texas, and Golden Pass Products LLC, (GPP) a limited liability company organized under the laws of the State of Delaware, made and entered into this **21st day of March, 2016**.

RECITALS

WHEREAS, Jefferson County, hereinafter called "Lessor", owns, operates, and has exclusive authority and power to operate the real property located in the County of Jefferson, State of Texas, known as the Jack Brooks Regional Airport (the "Airport");

WHEREAS, Golden Pass Products LLC, hereinafter called "Lessee", is qualified to do business in the State of Texas and desires to enter into a rental agreement with Lessor for the purpose of leasing space within the Airport, more specifically described herein, with the understanding that the scope of business operations permitted by this Lease Agreement is limited to those described herein, and nothing in this Lease Agreement may be construed as conferring any rights to the exclusion of any other tenant of the Airport;

WHEREAS, Lessor and Lessee have entered into a Letter of Intent on December 22, 2015 expressing the desire and intent of Lessor to lease terminal space to Lessee and Lessee to lease terminal space from Lessor chiefly on the terms included therein;

WHEREAS, Lessor represents that it has the right to grant the lease, together with all the facilities, rights, licenses, services, and privileges in the manner and to the extent hereinafter set forth; and

WHEREAS, Lessee intends to remodel the interior of the approximately 16,480 square foot of terminal shell space, hereinafter called "Shell Space", for its needs.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the premises and the mutual covenants herein contained, and for other good and valuable consideration, the parties hereto agree, for themselves, legal representatives and assignees as follows:

AGREEMENT

1. USE OF AIRPORT. Lessee, its employees, guests, patrons, and invitees shall have the right to the use (in common with other duly authorized users) of the Airport and its appurtenances, together with all facilities, improvements, equipment, and services that have been or may hereafter be provided for common use at or in connection with the Airport, subject to the Rules and Regulations of the Airport (the "Rules and Regulations") which are not in conflict with this Lease Agreement.

2. SPECIFIC RIGHTS OF LESSEE AT THE AIRPORT. Lessee shall have the right, in addition to all rights elsewhere granted in this Lease Agreement, to use the Airport for primarily for each of the following purposes, but not limited to other business purposes deemed necessary by GPP:

A. To conduct hiring, training, and orientation of persons, including all activities reasonably necessary to such operations;

B. To conduct meetings, seminars, hearings, conferences or other similar gatherings for public or private audiences to facilitate advancement of Lessee's public, governmental and/or industry-related activities;

C. To conduct drills, meetings, seminars, conferences or other similar gatherings to support ongoing operational activities with Golden Pass Products or its affiliates, governmental entities, industry groups and the public.

3. LESSEE RESPONSIBILITIES. In connection with the exercise of its rights under this Lease Agreement, Lessee:

A. Shall not, without first obtaining Lessor's written consent, use the demises premises for any other activity except as expressly provided in this Lease Agreement.

B. Shall not knowingly do or permit to be done anything at or about the Airport that may negatively interfere with the effectiveness or accessibility of the drainage and sewage system, water system, electrical system, heating system, natural gas, air conditioning system, fire protection system, sprinkler system, alarm system, fire hydrants and hoses, or other Airport systems installed or located on or within the premises of the Airport.

C. Lessee will comply with any applicable environmental regulations affecting its operations as required by Jefferson County, the State of Texas or the federal government. Lessee shall not conduct any maintenance or washing activities outside of an area designated by the Airport, with such area required to be designated by Airport so as to meet the operational needs of Lessee in a reasonable manner, and Lessee will take all reasonable precautions to capture any spills and to keep the premises free of discharges of hazardous chemicals or petroleum products. Lessee shall not engage in any activity or conduct, including but not limited to the use, treatment, generation, transportation, processing, handling, disposal, production or storage of hazardous substances, or the use of solvents, lubricants, petroleum, degreasers, or other compounds, in such a manner as to create an unreasonable risk of contamination of the soil or ground or open waters or the emission of vapors or gases which constitute atmospheric pollutants, which creates or may create an unlawful, dangerous, injurious, or noxious condition or that violates the terms or conditions of the Airport's environmental permits. Lessor shall have the right to monitor Lessee's activities, whether in an exclusive use area or in a common use area, for compliance with Airport's Spill Prevention Control and Counter Measure Plan and Storm Water Plan.

D. Lessee recognizes Airport's required compliance with Transportation Security Administration Regulations concerning airport security. Lessee agrees to cooperate and comply with such regulations and Airport's Airport Security Program as it relates to its use of the Airport's public facilities. Lessee shall take the necessary steps to prevent or deter unauthorized persons from obtaining access to the secured areas of the Airport. To the extent possible, Lessee agrees to cooperate with Lessor in dealing with aircraft and emergencies at the Airport. In the event of an emergency Lessee will fully cooperate with the Airport and assist in the implementation of the then current Airport Emergency Plan.

E. Lessee shall provide for the security of the Air Operations Area to prevent ground entry or movement of unauthorized persons from or through the Leased Premises in accordance with any regulations imposed upon Lessor by the Federal Aviation Administration. Lessee will indemnify and hold harmless Lessor, its officers and employees, from any charges, fines or penalties that may be levied by any agency of the United States or the State of Texas by reason of Lessee's failure to comply with this Lease Agreement.

4. TERM. The initial term of this Lease Agreement shall begin retroactively on January 01, 2016 (the "Commencement Date") and terminate without further notice on December 31, 2017 unless sooner terminated as provided herein or unless extended by mutual agreement of the parties under Section 5 of this Lease Agreement (the "Termination Date").

5. OPTION TERM AND RIGHT OF FIRST REFUSAL AND PREFERENTIAL RIGHT

A. At its sole discretion, Lessee shall have the option to extend the term of this Lease Agreement for up to an additional 60 months beyond the Termination Date at the same rates and adjustments included in this Lease Agreement (the "Extended Term"). The Extended Term shall be subject to the entire provisions of this Lease Agreement.

B. At its sole discretion Lessee has a right of first refusal for all or a portion of the Leased Premises if a bona fide offer is made to Lessor to rent all or any portion of the Leased Premises upon expiration of this Lease Agreement. Lessor shall first present the details of any such offers to Lessee. Lessee then has the right to match any such offer and rent the space on the same or better terms.

C. In the event any rental space comes available to rent at the Airport and such space abuts or is in close proximity to the Leased Premises, Lessor must first offer rental of that space to Lessee and enter into good faith negotiations to finalize a lease agreement should Lessee give notice that it wishes to exercise its preferential right to lease.

6. RENTALS AND FEES. The consideration that Lessee agrees to provide Lessor for leasing space under this Lease Agreement is to pay rentals and fees for the use of the premises, facilities, rights, licenses, services and privileges granted hereunder, according to the terms specified in the attached Exhibit "A".

7. PREMISES. The Leased Premises is described in detail in Exhibits "A" and "B" attached hereto. The parties understand and acknowledge that the shell space that is the subject of this Lease Agreement is not completed and that Lessee will be responsible for construction and remodeling of the interior space. The parties understand and acknowledge that Lessor will have full access to information on the design, layout, materials, and practices used of the interior to be constructed, as well as any exterior modifications including, but not limited to exterior doors, storefront windows, and walls. Lessee anticipates the construction period will commence within 90 days of GPP expansion project investment decision by its Shareholders. Dates of estimated completion and occupancy will be communicated in writing to the Lessor as the dates become available.

Lessee shall have the exclusive use of an area containing 16,480 square feet of Shell Space located in the terminal building, 55,900 square feet of parking lot, and 6,600 square feet of "Bull Pen"

area as identified on the attached Exhibit "B" ("Leased Premises") for such uses as Lessee finds necessary for the activities described in Section 2. In the event a new terminal is constructed by Airport prior to expiration of this Agreement, the parties will determine and agree upon the location, terms and conditions of Lessee's occupancy in the new terminal

8. MAINTENANCE AND OPERATION OF AIRPORT FACILITIES. Lessor agrees that it will maintain all appurtenant facilities connected therewith in good order and condition. Lessor agrees, except as herein otherwise provided, that it will, during the term of this lease, maintain and keep the Airport in a safe, workable, clean and sanitary condition and in good repair and free from obstruction. Lessor reserves the right further to develop or improve any area and all publicly-owned air navigation facilities of the Airport. Lessor reserves the right to take any action it considers necessary to protect the aerial approaches of the Airport against obstruction.

9. UTILITIES. Lessee, at its own expense, shall furnish all heat, air conditioning, electricity, janitorial, water and sewer for the shell space and will keep the public use premises in a neat, clean and sanitary condition. Lessee shall furnish its telephone service, security service, and provide janitorial service for the Leased Premises. If separation of utilities between the separate sections of the Main Commercial Terminal is not feasible, either physically or financially, Lessee agrees to compensate Lessor for any mutually agreed increase in utilities usage.

10. INSURANCE. Lessee shall maintain in full force and effect the forms of insurance as set forth in this Article 10. All such insurance shall be evidenced by certificates of insurance naming Lessor as an additional insured satisfactory to Lessor, evidencing coverage as required herein. Proof of required insurance will be furnished to Lessor with a certificate from the insurance carrier showing such insurance to be in full force and effect. Each policy or certificate shall contain a provision that written notice of cancellation or any material change in the policy by the insurer shall be delivered to Lessor, thirty (30) days in advance of the effective date.

A. Lessee shall prior to the execution of this lease, obtain public liability insurance for;

1. \$300,000 for personal injury/death for one person growing out of one accident or other cause, and;
2. \$500,000 for personal injury/death for two or more persons growing out of one accident or other cause, and;
3. \$500,000 for property damage growing out of any accident or other cause

B. The amounts of minimum coverage herein specified may be modified from time to time in compliance with Jefferson County requirements.

C. Lessee shall likewise maintain workers' compensation insurance, covering all its employees who may from time to time be on Airport premises in such capacity. Lessee shall require each of its agents, licenses, subcontractors, and suppliers for the Leased Premises to maintain such workers' compensation insurance covering their employees coming on Airport premises in connection with Lessee's operations hereunder. Upon request by Lessor, Lessee shall furnish Lessor with evidence of such workers' compensation insurance in a form acceptable to Lessor.

D. If any claim for damages is filed with Lessee or if any lawsuit is instituted against Lessee, Lessee shall give prompt and timely notice thereof to Lessor, provided that claims and lawsuits subject to such notice are only those that arise out of or are in any way connected with Lessee's use of the Leased Premises or Lessee's operations or activities in regard to the Airport and that in any way affect or might reasonably affect Lessor.

E. If any claim for damages is filed with Lessor or if any lawsuit is instituted against Lessor, Lessor shall give prompt and timely notice thereof to Lessee, provided that claims and lawsuits subject to such notice are only those that arise out of or are in any way connected with the operation of the Airport by Lessor and that in any way affect or might reasonably affect Lessee.

11. WAIVER OF SUBROGATION. In the event that the Leased Premises or any part of the Airport shall be destroyed in whole or in part by any cause or causes covered by standard fire and extended coverage insurance forms, Lessor shall not be liable for or responsible to Lessee or any insurer or insurers of Lessee and in the respect of any such damage or destruction and Lessee hereby specifically waives any and all right of subrogation, which its insurer or insurers may have against Lessor for such losses, damages or destruction of Lessee's property and the Leased Premises, all notwithstanding the fact that the same is caused in whole or in part by the neglect acts or omissions of Lessor or any of its officers, agents, employees, invitees or otherwise or by the neglect acts or omissions of Lessee or any of its officers, agents, employees, invitees or otherwise.

12. INDEMNIFICATION. Lessee agrees fully to indemnify, defend, and hold Lessor harmless from and against all claims and actions (and all expenses incidental to the investigation and defense thereof) based on or arising out of damages or injuries or death to any person or property caused by or arising out of the use, occupancy, or operations of Lessee at the Airport, to the extent caused by the negligent acts or omissions of Lessee, its employees or agents. Lessee shall not be liable for any injuries, death, damage, or loss to the extent that such injury, death, damage, or loss is caused by the fault or negligence of Lessor, its agents, or employees. Lessor shall give to Lessee prompt and reasonable notice of any such claims or actions.

13. DAMAGE OR DESTRUCTION OF PREMISES. In the event the premises covered by this lease are wholly or partially destroyed or damaged so as to render the whole or a substantial part thereof unfit for occupancy or the use contemplated by this Lease Agreement, and the same cannot be repaired with reasonable diligence within one hundred twenty (120) days after the happening of such destruction or damage, then this lease, at the option of Lessee shall cease and terminate as of the date of such destruction or damage. Upon such termination, Lessor shall repay to Lessee any rents previously paid by Lessee with respect to any period subsequent to the date of such termination, and Lessee shall surrender possession of the premises to Lessor. If such destruction or damage can be repaired within one hundred twenty (120) days, Lessor shall forthwith repair the same with all reasonable diligence, and at its own expense (unless such damage was caused by the negligence or actions of Lessee, its employees, and/or agents in which case Lessee shall repair the premises subject to the terms of Sections 10 and 11) and this lease shall continue in force and effect.

14. CANCELLATION BY LESSOR. Lessor shall have the right, in the event Lessor requires the premises for expansion or development of the Airport, to cancel this lease in its entirety, to be effective at the end of any specified month, provided it gives not less than ninety (90) days written notice to Lessee of its intent to cancel this lease in its entirety. Lessor may cancel this Lease Agreement upon giving Lessee ninety (90) days written notice, upon or after the happening of any of the following events:

- A. nonpayment of rent and fees to Lessor by Lessee after ten (10) days' notice to Lessee of nonpayment;
- B. the filing by Lessee of a voluntary petition in bankruptcy, the adjudication of Lessee as a bankruptcy pursuant to involuntary bankruptcy proceedings, or the appointment of a receiver of Lessee's assets;
- C. the abandonment by Lessee of the premises at the Airport;
- D. the default by Lessee in the performance of any other covenants or agreements herein required to be performed by Lessee (except as set forth above) and the failure of Lessee to remedy such default for a period of thirty (30) days after receipt from Lessor of written notice to remedy the same; provided, however, that no notice of cancellation, as above provided, shall be of any force or effect if Lessee shall have remedied the default prior to receipt of Lessor's notice of cancellation.
- E. No waiver of default shall be construed to be or act as a waiver by Lessor of any subsequent default of any of the terms, covenants and conditions herein contained to be performed, kept and observed by Lessee.

15. CANCELLATION BY LESSEE. Lessee may cancel this Lease Agreement after the happening of any one of the following events:

- A. Issuance by any court of competent jurisdiction of any injunction in any way preventing or restraining the use of the Airport or any part thereof for Airport purposes;
- B. The material breach by Lessor of any of the covenants or agreements herein contained and the failure of Lessor to remedy such breach for a period of sixty (60) days after receipt of a written notice of the existence of such breach;
- C. The inability of Lessee to use said premises and facilities continuing for a period in excess of sixty (60) days due to any deficiency of the Airport or unsafe condition for operating at the Airport;
- D. The assumption by the United States Government, or any authorized agency thereof, of control of the Airport and facilities or any substantial part or parts thereof such that Lessee is unable to fulfill its obligation to provide regularly scheduled air transportation to and from the Airport.
- E. No waiver of default shall be construed to be or act as a waiver by Lessee of any subsequent default of any of the terms, covenants and conditions herein contained to be performed, kept and observed by County.

16. CARE AND SURRENDER OF PREMISES. Upon the expiration or other termination of this Lease Agreement, Lessee's authority to use the premises, rights and facilities herein granted shall cease, and Lessee shall, upon such expiration or termination, promptly and in good condition, ordinary wear and tear excepted, surrender the same to the Airport. Except as otherwise provided in this article, all improvements, equipment and other property bought, installed, erected or placed by Lessee in, on, or about the Airport shall be deemed to be personal and shall remain the property of Lessee, and Lessee shall have the right at any time during the term of this lease and prior to thirty (30) days after its expiration or other termination to remove any or all of its property from Lessor; provided, Lessee is not in default in its payments to Lessor hereunder and subject further to Lessee's obligation to repair all damage, if any, resulting from such removal; and provided further, that if Lessee fails to remove any such structures, fixtures, equipment and other property, they may be removed by the Airport at Lessee's expense, or Lessor may, at its option, take title to these items or property in lieu of removal by or for Lessee.

17. ASSIGNMENT AND SUBLEASE. Lessee shall not assign this Lease Agreement or any part hereof in any manner whatsoever or sublet the premises or any part thereof or any of the privileges recited herein without the prior written consent of Lessor. However, Lessee shall have the right to assign all or any part of its rights and interests under this Lease Agreement to any Affiliated Lessee or to any successor to Lessee's business through merger, consolidation, voluntary sale, or transfer of substantially all of its assets, and the consent of Lessor thereto shall not be required, but due notice of any such assignment shall be given to the Airport Director within thirty (30) days after such assignment hereunder. No assignment, transfer, conveyance, sublease, or granting of a nonexclusive license by Lessee shall relieve Lessee of its responsibility for payment of rent and performance of all other obligations provided in this Lease Agreement, without specific written consent of Lessor to such relief. As used in this Section 17, "Affiliated Lessee" means (i) any wholly owned or majority-owned subsidiary of Lessee; (ii) any Lessee participating in a major marketing alliance with Lessee; or (iii) any Lessee having the same ultimate parent company as Lessee.

18. COMPLIANCE WITH LAW. Lessee shall not use the Airport or any part thereof, or knowingly permit the same to be used by any of its employees, officers, agents, invitees, or licensees, for any illegal purposes and shall, at all times during the term of this Lease Agreement, comply with all applicable ordinances, laws, and the Rules and Regulations and of any applicable rules and regulations of a city, county, or state government or state agency or of the U.S. Government, and of any political division or subdivision or agency, city, or commission thereof that may have jurisdiction to pass laws or ordinances or to make and enforce rules and regulations with respect to the uses hereunder. It is understood that nothing herein contained shall be construed to grant or authorize the granting of an exclusive right to Lessee.

19. NONDISCRIMINATION. Lessee, as part of the consideration hereof and as a covenant running with this Lease Agreement, hereby covenants and agrees that:

- A. Lessee shall provide services and shall use the premises in compliance with all other requirements imposed pursuant to Title 49, Code of Federal Regulations, Department of Transportation, Subtitle A, Office of the Secretary, Part 21, Nondiscrimination in Federally

Assisted Programs of the Department of Transportation, Effectuation of Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, and as such regulations may be amended.

B. No person on the grounds of race, color, national origin, sex, physical handicap, or other classification protected under federal or state law shall be excluded from participation in, denied the benefits of, or be otherwise subjected to discrimination in the use of said facilities.

C. No person on the grounds of race, color, national origin, sex, physical handicap, or other classification protected under federal or state law shall be excluded from participation in, denied the benefits of, or otherwise be subjected to discrimination in the construction of any improvements on, over, or under the Leased Premises and the furnishing of services thereon.

D. Lessee shall furnish its accommodations and/or services on a fair, equal, and not unjustly discriminatory basis to all users thereof, and it shall charge not unjustly discriminatory prices for each unit of service. Lessee assures Lessor that Lessee will undertake an affirmative action program as required by FAA Regulations, Title 14, Code of Federal Regulations, Part 152, Subpart E, entitled "Nondiscrimination in Airport Aid Programs, "or otherwise approved by the FAA, to ensure that no person shall, on the grounds of race, creed, color, national origin, sex, physical handicap, or other classification protected under federal or state law be excluded from participation in any employment activities covered in such Subpart E. Lessee further assures Lessor that no person shall be excluded on such grounds from participating in any employment activities covered in such Subpart E. Lessee further assures Lessor that it will require that its covered subcontractors provide assurances to Lessee that they similarly will undertake affirmative action programs and that they will require assurances from their subcontractors, as required by Title 14, Code of Federal Regulations, Part 152, Subpart E, to the same effect.

E. Lessee covenants and agrees that no person shall be excluded from participation in, denied the benefits of, or otherwise discriminated against in the performance of this Lease Agreement on the grounds of race, color, national origin or sex, as provided in Part 23 of Title 49 of the Code of Federal Regulations entitled "Participation by Minority Business Enterprises in Department of Transportation Programs".

F. In the event of a breach by Lessee of any of the assurances or covenants in this Article 19 which are not cured by Lessee within ten (10) days after receipt of written notice from Lessor, Lessor shall have the right to terminate this Lease Agreement, and to reenter and repossess any leased facilities hereunder, and to hold the same as if this Lease Agreement had never been made or issued, but not without the express prior concurrence or direction of the U.S. Department of Transportation or the FAA following suitable review, if any, of such breach and affording Lessee a reasonable opportunity to rectify the same.

G. Lessee and Lessor agree to each fulfill its obligations for handicapped access as required by law. The parties, in assessing their responsibility, shall allocate the responsibilities pursuant to the regulations consistent with the allocation of responsibilities otherwise set forth in this Lease Agreement. In the event the parties

cannot agree as to their respective obligations pursuant to said regulation, the parties agree to seek the assistance of the FAA in interpreting and applying the applicable regulations.

20. NONINTERFERENCE WITH OPERATION OF THE AIRPORT. Lessee, by accepting this Lease Agreement, expressly agrees for itself, its successors, and assigns that it will not make use of the Leased Premises in any manner that might improperly interfere with the landing and taking off of aircraft at the Airport or otherwise constitute a hazard. In the event the aforesaid covenant is breached, upon reasonable notice to Lessee and opportunity to cure, Lessor reserves the right to abate such interference as may be appropriate at the expense of Lessee.

21. SEVERABILITY. If one or more clauses, sections, or provisions of this Lease Agreement shall be held to be unlawful, invalid, or unenforceable, it is agreed that the remainder of the Agreement shall not be affected thereby.

22. QUIET ENJOYMENT. Lessee shall, upon payment of the rentals and fees herein required, and subject to performance and compliance by Lessee of the covenants, conditions, and agreements on the part of Lessee to be performed and complied with hereunder, peaceably have and enjoy the rights, uses, and privileges of the Airport, its appurtenance, and facilities as granted hereby and by the Rules and Regulations.

23. TAXES.

A. Lessee shall pay, but such payment shall not be considered part of Airport Revenue, all taxes (including any possessory interest tax), assessments, and charges of a like nature, if any, which at any time during the term of this Lease Agreement may be levied against Lessee or become a lien by virtue of any levy, assessment, or charge against Lessee by the federal government, the State of Texas, or, to the extent having competent jurisdiction, or any other tax assessment levying bodies, any municipal corporation, any local government entity, any government successor in authority to the foregoing, or any other tax or assessment levying bodies, in whole or in part, upon or in respect to any of the space leased under this Lease Agreement or such facilities of the Airport as are made available for use by Lessee hereunder, or upon or in respect to any personal property belonging to Lessee situated on the space leased under this Lease Agreement. Payment of such taxes, assessments, and charges, when and if levied or assessed, shall be made by Lessee directly to the taxing or assessing authority charged with collection thereof.

B. Lessee may, at its own expense, contest the amount or validity of any tax or assessment, or the inclusion of the space leased under this Lease Agreement as taxable or assessable property, directly against the taxing or assessing authority. Lessee shall indemnify Lessor from all taxes, penalties, costs, expenses, and attorneys' fees incurred by Lessor resulting directly or indirectly from all such tax contests.

C. On any termination of this Lease Agreement, all lawful taxes then levied or a lien upon any such property or taxable interest therein shall be paid in full by Lessee forthwith, or as soon as a statement thereof has been issued by the tax collector if termination occurs during the interval between attachment of the lien and issuance of a statement.

24. SUBORDINATION TO AGREEMENTS WITH THE U.S. GOVERNMENT. This Lease Agreement is subject and subordinate to the provisions of any agreements heretofore or hereafter made between Lessor and the United States, relative to the operation or maintenance of the Airport, the execution of which has been required as a condition precedent to the transfer of federal rights or property to Lessor for Airport purposes, or to the expenditure of federal funds for the improvement or development of the Airport, including the expenditure of federal funds for the development of the Airport.

A. In the event that the FAA requires, as a condition precedent to the granting of funds for the improvement of the Airport, modifications or changes to this Lease Agreement, Lessee agrees to consent to such reasonable amendments, modifications, revisions, supplements, or deletions of any of the terms, conditions, or requirements of this Lease Agreement as may be reasonably required to enable Lessor to obtain such grant of funds, provided that in no event shall such changes impair the rights of Lessee hereunder.

25. HOLDING OVER. If Lessee remains in possession of the Leased Premises after the expiration of this Lease Agreement without any written renewal thereof, such holding over shall not be deemed as a renewal or extension of this Lease Agreement, but shall create only a tenancy from month to month that may be terminated at any time by either party upon thirty (30) days written notice. Such holding over shall otherwise be upon the same terms and conditions as set forth in this Lease Agreement.

26. CONSENT NOT TO BE UNREASONABLY WITHHELD. Whenever consent or approval is required herein by either Lessor (including without limitation, by Airport Director), or Lessee, such consent or approval is not to be unreasonably withheld or delayed.

27. AUTHORITY OF AIRPORT DIRECTOR. All rights and obligations of Lessor under this Lease Agreement may be exercised by the Airport Director or designee, unless specifically provided otherwise or required by law.

28. AMENDMENTS. This Lease Agreement may be amended in whole or in part without further consideration upon mutual written consent of both parties.

29. EMPLOYEES OF LESSEE. Lessee shall require all of its employees, subcontractors, or independent contractors hired by Lessee working in view of the public and about the Terminal Building to wear clean and neat attire. Lessee will also require all of its employees servicing the public at the Airport to be polite, courteous, and helpful to the public.

30. LICENSES, FEES AND PERMITS. Lessee shall obtain and pay for all licenses, fees, permits, or other authorization or charges as required under federal, State, or local laws and regulations insofar as they are necessary to comply with the requirements of this Lease Agreement and the privileges extended hereunder.

31. PRUDENT OPERATOR. Lessor agrees to operate the Airport in a prudent manner consistent with its statutory obligations.

32. NATIONAL EMERGENCY. This Lease Agreement and all the provisions hereof shall be subject to whatever right the U.S. Government now has, or in the future may have or acquire, affecting

the control, operation, regulation, and taking over of said Airport or the exclusive or nonexclusive use of the Airport by the United States during the time of war or national emergency.

33. REPRESENTATIONS AND WARRANTIES. Lessor represents and warrants to Lessee that on the date hereof, the Leased Premises are in as-is condition and that all mechanical systems currently installed are operable. Lessee acknowledges that the condition of the water and sewer located within the Shell Space is unknown and may require substantial modifications to suit Lessee's needs. Nothing contained in this Lease Agreement shall be deemed to create the relationship of principal and agent or of partnership or joint venture or any relationship between Lessor and Lessee. This Lease Agreement and all disputes arising hereunder shall be governed by the laws of the State of Texas.

34. NOTICES. All notice required to be given to the Airport shall be given by certified mail as follows:

EXHIBIT "A"**RENTALS AND FEES**

For and in consideration of the rent and all covenants herein contained, Lessee agrees to pay to Lessor and Lessor agrees to accept from Lessee for the use of the facilities, rights, licenses, services and privileges granted hereunder, monthly rentals and fees as noted herein.

1. TERMINAL RENTALS: Effective upon substantial completion of the interior modifications, but no later than December 31, 2017 and for the term hereof, Lessee shall pay to Lessor the equivalent of \$8,240 per month for the following "Leased Premises":

A. For the exclusive use of 16,480 square feet of Terminal Shell Space; and

B. For the exclusive use of 55,900 square feet of Parking Lot located immediately adjacent to the east side of the Terminal called the East Wing, containing approximately 150 parking spaces and 6,600 square feet of vacant concrete located between the Terminal Shell Space and the Parking Lot made available by the Airport.


2. PAYMENT TERMS: Payment for the Leased Premises shall be made as follows:

**Note: Above diagram not to scale, for general informational purposes only.



Report on the Financial Statements

We have audited the accompanying financial statements of the Texas Juvenile Justice Department Grant Funds of Jefferson County Juvenile Probation Department (Department), which comprise the statement of revenues, expenditures and changes in fund balances – budget and actual-regulatory basis for the year ended August 31, 2015, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management's Responsibility for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of these financial statements in accordance with the financial reporting provisions of the Texas Juvenile Justice Department. Management is also responsible for the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

Auditors' Responsibility

Our responsibility is to express an opinion on these financial statements based on our audit and the standards applicable to financial audits contained in *Government Auditing Standards*, issued by the Comptroller General of the United States. We conducted our audit in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America. Those standards require that we plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements are free from material misstatement.

An audit involves performing procedures to obtain audit evidence about the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements. The procedures selected depend on the auditors' judgment, including the assessment of the risks of material misstatement of the financial statements, whether due to fraud or error. In making those risk assessments, the auditor considers internal control relevant to the entity's preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the entity's internal control. We draw attention to Note 1 of the financial statements, which describes the basis of accounting. The financial statements are prepared on the basis of the financial reporting provision of the Texas Juvenile Justice Department, which is a basis of accounting other than accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America, to comply with the requirements of the Texas Juvenile Justice Department. Our opinion is not modified with respect to that matter.

Emphasis Matter

As discussed in Note 1, the financial statement presents the results of operations of the Department's Texas Juvenile Justice Department Grant Funds only and is not intended to present fairly the results of operations of the County in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

Other Reporting Required by Government Auditing Standards

In accordance with *Government Auditing Standards*, we have also issued our report dated February 29, 2016, on our consideration of the Department's internal control over financial reporting and on our tests of its compliance with certain provisions of laws, regulations, contracts, grant agreements and other matters. The purpose of that report is to describe the scope of our testing of internal control over financial reporting and compliance and the results of that testing, and not to provide an opinion on internal control over financial reporting or on compliance. That report is an integral part of an audit performed in accordance with *Government Auditing Standards* in considering Jefferson County's internal control over financial reporting and compliance.

This report is intended solely for the information and use of management, Jefferson County, others within Jefferson County Juvenile Probation Department and the Texas Juvenile Justice Department and is not intended to be and should not be used by anyone other than these specified parties.

NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

FOR THE YEAR ENDED AUGUST 31, 2015

1. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Entity

The Texas Juvenile Justice Department Grant Funds of Jefferson County (the “Funds”) were established to account for juvenile probation services funded by the Texas Juvenile Justice Department (TJJD) in Jefferson County, Texas.

The Funds provide separate accountability as required under the State Financial Assistance Contract, by TJJD. The Funds are used to account for each separate program, matching funds and all related expenditures incurred.

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements were prepared in conformity with the accounting practices prescribed by TJJD, which prescribes policies and procedures for county probation departments, which is a comprehensive basis of accounting other than generally accepted accounting principles. These accounting practices include the following:

- The financial statements are reported using the accrual basis of accounting. Revenues are recorded when all eligibility requirements have been met and expenditures are recorded when incurred.
- The accompanying financial statements do not represent financial statements prepared in accordance with provisions for governmental funds as prescribed by the Governmental Accounting Standards Board.
- The accompanying financial statements are prepared in a format to facilitate uniform financial reporting by county probation departments.

2. RECONCILIATION OF INTEREST EARNED

Idle funds were maintained in an interest bearing account. The reconciliation of interest earned on funds received from TJJD is as follows:

4. FEDERAL FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE

The Texas Juvenile Justice Department administers, along with the Texas Department of Family and Protective Services, the Title IV-E Program (CFDA 93.658). TJJD disburses funds to Jefferson County Juvenile Probation Department on a cost reimbursement basis. The Department did not receive any Title IV-E funds during fiscal year 2015.

5. FINANCIAL MATCH REQUIREMENTS

To receive Texas Juvenile Department state funds, the juvenile probation departments are required to certify that the amount of local or county funds expended for juvenile services is at least equal to or greater than the amount spent in the 2006 county fiscal year excluding construction and capital outlay expenses. A confirmation of local funds for the year ending August 31, 2015 is required and presented below:

6. STATE FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE

Accordingly, we do not express an opinion on the effectiveness of Jefferson County Juvenile Probation Department's internal control.

A *deficiency in internal control* exists when the design or operation of a control does not allow management or employees, in the normal course of performing their assigned functions, to prevent, or detect and correct, misstatements on a timely basis. A *material weakness* is a deficiency, or a combination of deficiencies, in internal control, such that there is a reasonable possibility that a material misstatement of the entity's financial statements will not be prevented, or detected and corrected on a timely basis. A *significant deficiency* is a deficiency, or a combination of deficiencies, in internal control that is less severe than a material weakness, yet important enough to merit attention by those charged with governance.

Our consideration of internal control was for the limited purpose described in the first paragraph of this section and was not designed to identify all deficiencies in internal control that might be material weaknesses or, significant deficiencies. Given these limitations, during our audit we did not identify any deficiencies in internal control that we consider to be material weaknesses. However, material weaknesses may exist that have not been identified.

Compliance and Other Matters

As part of obtaining reasonable assurance about whether the Jefferson County Juvenile Probation Department's financial statements are free from material misstatement, we performed tests of its compliance with certain provisions of laws, regulations, contracts, and grant agreements, noncompliance with which could have a direct and material effect on the determination of financial statement amounts. However, providing an opinion on compliance with those provisions was not an objective of our audit, and accordingly, we do not express such an opinion. The results of our tests disclosed no instances of noncompliance or other matters that are required to be reported under *Government Auditing Standards*.

Minimum Earned Premium

A minimum earned premium endorsement can be attached to either a flat charge policy or an adjustable policy. In either case, this amount is the LEAST that will be retained by the insurance company once the policy goes into effect. The amount retained would be the GREATER of the actual earned premium whether calculated on a pro-rate or short rate basis, or the minimum earned premium.
