Average monthly wage for farm laborers in 1850. Day laborers were paid \$1.00 per day without board and .75¢ daily with board.

576,000

Number of shingles handmade by Marvin Delano and four employees (3 male and 1 female) at Beaumont in 1850. The shingles were worth \$1,152.



MATCHETT HERRING COE SOUTHEAST TEXAS SCULPTOR 1907— 1999

CLG COMMUNITY OUTREACH MEETING

The Certified Local Government (CLG) Committee held a community outreach meeting on April 26, 2016, at the Precinct One Service Center in China, Texas. Community members from China, Nome and Bevil Oaks were invited to attend and learn about the historic resources survey project. Historic Preservation Officer, Sarah Bellian, and all of the CLG committee members were in attendance as well as about fifteen interested members of the public ranging in age from Miss Cassidy Lewis, aged four, to senior members of the China community.

Sara Bellian handed out survey packets and explained what kinds of items make up a historic resources survey, such as historic places, buildings, people, collections of photographs and memorabilia, and oral histories.

Community members asked good questions and shared stories about local history such as the World War II POW camp in China, and local rice farming and ranching. They also talked about organizing their own meetings before asking the CLG committee to come back and collect the information gathered by the community.

Kathy Lewis, an Election Judge in China, shared some early photographs of her home which was built in approximately 1904, and was the first home out on Blanch Road. She also shared a collection of newspaper articles, rodeo memorabilia, and other items of interest.

China resident, Ronald Kuebodeaux, also residing on Blanch Road, discussed his extensive collection of photographs, articles and artifacts documenting the history of China which he graciously offered to show to committee members and possibly have digitized by volunteers for the historic resources survey. Mr. Kuebodeaux had also attended a CLG committee meeting in August of 2015.

TEXAS GULF HISTORICAL SOCIETY SPRING MEETING

On April 27, 2016, the Texas Gulf Historical Society held its spring meeting at the McFaddin-Ward House Visitor Center. The speaker was John William "Bill" O'Neal, the Texas state historian, appointed in 2012 by Gov. Rick Perry. Dr. O'Neal is an historian, author, radio host, professor and public speaker, having written 42 books and hundreds of articles and book reviews on the American West, country music, baseball and children's books. He is past president of the East Texas Historical Association and on the board of the Texas Country Music Hall of Fame.

Dr. O'Neal gave a very informative and entertaining presentation on Sam Houston's life and his leadership qualities. In fact Dr. O'Neal's latest book is titled, "Sam Houston: A Study in Leadership" which he describes as a biographical treatment with a focus on leadership.

BEAUMONT HERITAGE SOCIETY HERITAGE HAPPY HOUR TOUR OF MAGNOLIA CEMETERY

Beaumont Heritage Society hosted their Heritage Happy Hour at Magnolia Cemetery on Thursday, April 28, 2016. A tour of the cemetery was held with graveside docents telling the compelling stories of some of Beaumont's earliest citizens. JCHC members, Paul Prosperie and Mike McGreevy, were two of the docents discussing the lives and grave markers of citizens such as Catherina Jeanette Stengele, a milliner and successful businesswoman, born in Holland in 1866, who died in 1909, and Confederate soldier, William A. Fletcher, author of "Rebel Private: Front and Rear— Memoirs of a Confederate Soldier".

The successful cemetery tour resulted in 94 paid attendees and 18 new memberships, and was so well received an encore tour may be held in the fall.
