Supreme Court of Texas Emergency Order

The Supreme Court of Texas issued its 27th Emergency Order of the pandemic on Friday. The order establishes the Texas Eviction Diversion Program and coincides with Governor Greg Abbott's announcement of \$171 million in funding from the CARES Act to be used for rental assistance and legal aid for tenants who are behind on their rent.

MCLE Deadlines Extended

We understand that the pandemic has made it difficult for some attorneys to complete their MCLE requirements on time. In response, the State Bar of Texas MCLE Department granted several extensions. Below are the current extensions offered.

Attorneys with the following birth months:

- June—granted a 90-day extension with a final deadline of September 30.
- July—granted a 90-day extension with a final deadline of October 31.
- August—granted a 90-day extension with a final deadline of November 30.
- September—granted a 60-day extension with a current deadline of November 30.
- October—granted a 60-day extension with a current deadline of December 31.
